Arizona Scenario

From 2006 – 2015, an average of 979 chronic hepatitis B and 128 acute hepatitis B cases were reported each year, though there has been a decrease in the number of acute hepatitis B cases identified in recent years.

The rate of new reports of acute HBV was highest among persons aged 40-44 years. Chronic HBV rates were highest among those 30-34 years.

The average annual rate of hepatitis B infection amongst Asians/ Pacific Islanders was much higher than among other racial/ethnic groups. ce: 2016 Viral Hepatitis Epidemiologic Profile for Arizona: 2016, Arizona Department of Health Services

Figure 4C. Age-Adjusted Average Annual Mortality Rates of HBV by Race/Ethnicity, Arizona, 2011 – 2014

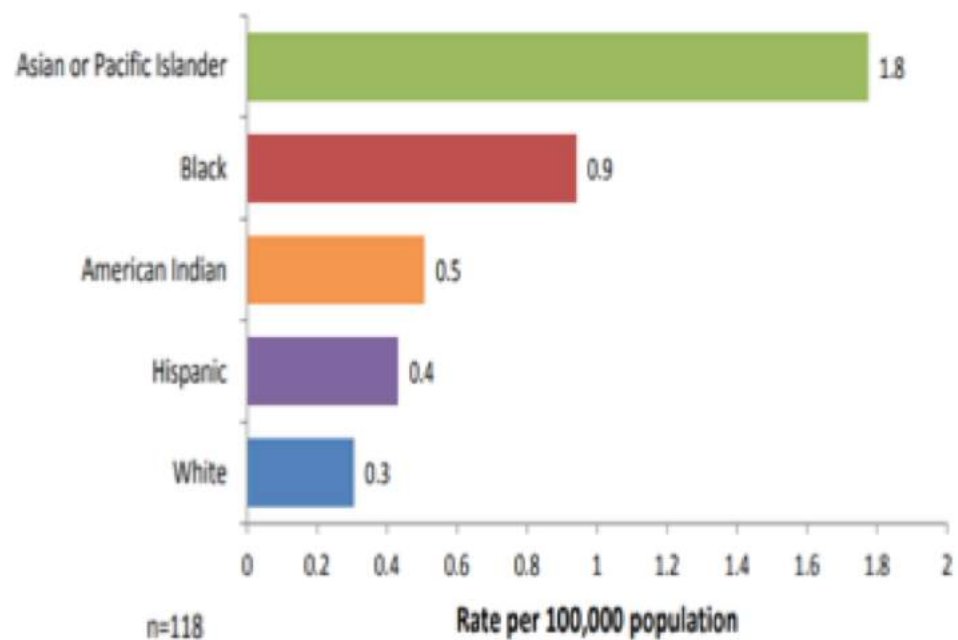
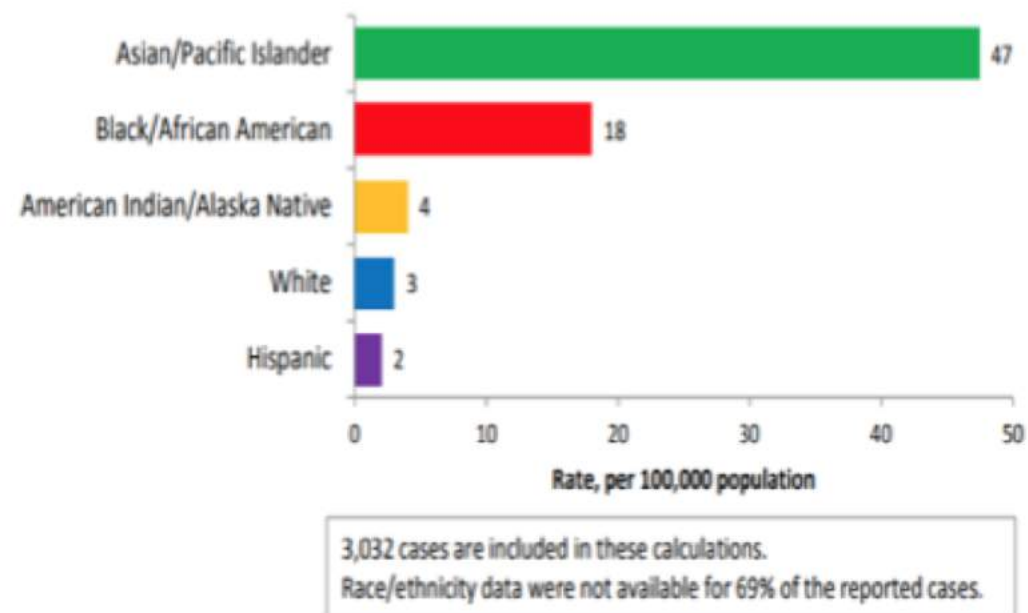


Figure 1C. Average Rate of Chronic Hepatitis B per 100,000 population, by Race/Ethnicity, 2006 – 2015



APCA Research

Locally, APCA tested 2869 people and found that 6.7% had active HepB and an additional 31.2% were not vaccinated.


